Indications of instability or a need for urgent transfer to hospital...</li> <li>o In my opinion, authors should explain in more detail strategies to prevent aspiration in dentistry. Dentists should always be aware of a protocol not only for prevention but also for management of such iatrogenic cases.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
