<b>Compulsory</b> REVISION comments	<p>This paper describes that percussion can be a valuable bedside aid in determining the cardiac size, borders and finding the presence and extent of pericardial fluid. With proper knowledge and experience, cardiac percussion can be a helpful tool in specific cardiac pathologies. The conclusion is that percussion can be a significant bedside help in deciding the cardiovascular size, borders, and tracking down the presence and degree of pericardial liquid.</p> <p><b>The number of words in the abstract is 323 words, which is too many for an abstract. Some sentences in the abstract should be revised and summarized to 150-200 words.</b></p>	
<b>Minor</b> REVISION comments	<p>I notice some grammatical problems in this article:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>On Abstract line 1, I found "The growing abundance of technology <b>in medical field</b> has led to doctors' sensory de-skilling." The noun phrase "<b>medical field</b>" seems to be missing a determiner before it. Consider adding an article "<b>the medical field</b>".</li> <li>On Abstract line 2, I found "Percussion as <b>a skill has lost</b> from clinical practice." It seems that you are missing a verb. Consider adding it "<b>a skill has been lost</b>".</li> <li>On Abstract line 4, I found "Percussion is a very vital component <b>in bedside examination</b> of the patient." It seems that there is an article usage problem here. Consider changing it "<b>in the bedside examination</b>".</li> <li>In Introduction line 1, I found "There was a time when percussion was a very important component <b>in clinical assessment</b> of heart disease." The noun phrase "<b>clinical assessment</b>" seems to be missing a determiner before it. Consider adding an article "<b>the clinical assessment</b>".</li> </ol>
