<u>Compulsory</u> REVISION comments	<p>Abstract: Informations given are not found in the manuscript. No conclusions are drawn.</p> <p>Introduction: No references are given, or the paragraph cited is too long- only 2 references for the whole introduction.</p> <p>Background: please reformulate - only one reference?</p> <p>Methodology and materials: "various articles" expression is not desirable. Should be rephrased, and number of articles, source, search criteria are mandatory. Several articles are presented, but not necessarily related to method (!). The authors also included informations that should be changed to conclusions or discussions.</p> <p>Pathogenesis : this chapter is used after (!?) materials and methods. No standard format is used (if material and methods, results, conclusions format is used, please rephrase properly; if review format is used, then material and methods chapter should be rephrased/renamed accordingly References are not used properly: same reference for different paragraph (!?) Almost 2 pages without reference. No information on changing the article/patients during the article - very hard to follow.</p> <p>Discussions on - "cannot understand the chapter name . English grammar (by a native English language speaker) is mandatory for this chapter, as the information is hard to follow.</p> <p>Conclusions: should be based on given information in the manuscript (no general information about hand disinfectants).</p> <p>References: - should be used the same format !</p> <p>English grammar and translation issues should be carefully revised !</p>	
<u>Minor</u> REVISION comments	<p>numerous English grammar issues- e.g.: "took COVID" "with a mild" SARS - Co- role V"</p> <p>COVID 19 - should be used the same name (not coronavirus and COVID and Covid and COVID 19 and SARS COV 2...) and explained properly at the first usage.</p> <p>"urticarial@ rash"</p> <p>-social network informations should not be included in a medical review paper, as the informations cannot be trusted/verified</p>	
<u>Optional/General</u> comments	<p>The article presents some results on COVID 19's skin manifestations. The article needs to be rearranged (using a given format: original or review). Given information should be properly cited.</p>
